Reason: The trees have been pollarded historically but are now over-stood with several years of growth. This has resulted in extensively over-weighted limbs which are in danger of collapse. There are also signs of		

			significant decay in the bolling of all 3 trees. All 3 trees crowns would reach the public footpath (which is downwind of the prevailing winds on the site) and therefore pose a significant hazard to pedestrians. A similar sized willow in the same location collapsed some years ago, falling over the public footpath and severing the electricity cable supplying power to the village of Little Waltham.
